




#### IB /IG Inter-House Equestrian Competition


### A Beginner's Guide to Collagraphy

Collagraphy' has much in common, yet is very different from, a number of the modern art forms. It is a printmaking process in which materials are applied to a rigid substrate (such as paperboard or wood). The word is derived from the Greek word koll or kolla, meaning glue, and graph, meaning the activity of drawing.

Through the Visual Arts Activity lessons held in the month of November, students of the IGCSE program were taught this unique style of art. They prepared substrates by sticking newspaper, strings, and glue on mount boards. Once the plates were ready, black printing ink was rolled on them with the help of hand rollers/brayers. From that point onwards, it was left to the students to let their imagination run wild. A clean sheet of white paper was placed over their handiwork, pressed down with one hand while the other hand burnished the print. The results were largely reflective of the students' innovation and creative minds.

It was an exciting learning experience for the pupils that participated, who said afterward that they would love to participate in future workshops like this one, to learn about different art forms from all over the world.






#### Sustained Success on the MUN Front

#### Dear parents

We are happy to announce that the we have successfully launched "The Mentor-Mentee Program" for GDGWS boarding students, on the 30<sup>th</sup> of October, 2017, with the preliminary meeting of the boarding staff with the Principal, Heads of Program (HOP's) and the designated mentors. The aim of this program is to share with parents the academic progress of their wards and steps taken by mentors to assist students in case of any difficulties including, but not limited to: difficult subjects, stationary and equipment, academic performance, and remediation.

To strengthen the mentor-mentee bond, the academic tutorial is held every Thursday between 6.30 and 8.30 pm to share the mentees progress and any update the mentee wants to share. The mentors, and dorm parents are working hard towards improving the results that our boarders attain, by giving each of them the individual attention that they require to perform successfully for their upcoming IGCSE and IB exams.

Part of the method mentors employ is the discussion of past-paper questions, and to help them solve them during their evening remediation classes. A follow-up meeting with mentors is held every fortnight with the Director-Principal, the DHM and the respective HOP's. Sometimes the mentees and dorm parents also attend the meetings to share the key concerns or suggest solutions to problems. We all need to take up the challenge, and walk an extra mile for the betterment of our student's results and future.
