
From the Principal's Desk



Learners then reflected on their learning by mapping migration journeys on a world map, making global connections while strengthening their research and communication skills.

As a provocation, students explored powerful images of global challenges, shared their prior knowledge, and inquired into the underlying causes. Through videos, real-world data, and case studies from countries such as South Sudan and Afghanistan, they developed a deeper understanding of global issues and their geographical spread. Using web maps and cause-and-effect charts, they identified common causes and impacts, particularly on children. Discussions and reading activities further enriched their understanding of how conflict, poverty, and cultural practices contribute to inequality.











GRADE 5

The recent unit on governance sparked meaningful discussions on family roles, rules, and decision-making. Students used Y-charts to explore rule-making at home and connected their learning to the transdisciplinary theme. They researched global government systems, read about various types, and debated their effectiveness. Through engaging activities and discussions, students deepened their understanding of democratic and non-democratic systems while strengthening their critical thinking skills.









Specialist subjects

Hindi

Across Grades 1 to 5, students engaged in a range of Hindi language activities to strengthen their reading, writing, and comprehension skills.

- Grade 1: Recapped Vyanjan and were introduced to Swar through poems and writing, complemented by a fun lesson on traffic signals and road safety.
- Grade 2: Explored a new maatra through stories, comprehension exercises, and the "Suno Aur Likho" listening activity.
- Grade 3: Focused on reading comprehension, sentence formation, and pronouns (Sarvnam) through Dumb Charades and related exercises.
- Grade 4: Reinforced their understanding of Sarvnam through integrated language activities and reflected on their summer break using the 3-2-1 strategy.
- Grade 5: Developed critical thinking through reading tasks, paragraph writing on the "Rainy Season," and a musical game to encourage fluency and spontaneity.











Specialist subjects

ART

Students across Grades Nursery to 5 explored creativity through engaging, hands-on art experiences.

- Foundation 1 and 2: Learners enjoyed sensory activities, including a fragrant coffee painting.
- Foundation 3: Students expressed their love for family by decorating photo frames, building fine motor skills.
- Grade 1: Explored colouring, shading, and blending techniques to enhance artistic expression.
- Grade 2: Discovered abstract art inspired by Wassily Kandinsky, experimenting with shapes and colours.
- Grade 3: Learned about George Seurat's dotted painting style and experimented with Pointillism.
- Grade 4: Explored Doodle Art as a medium for self-expression and creativity.
- Grade 5: Delved into the dynamic world of Jackson Pollock, creating bold artworks using drip and splatter techniques.

Each activity not only sparked creativity but also helped students build focus, confidence, and essential artistic skills.

DANCE

In Dance, Nursery students completed their performance of "Put Your Hands Up" and began learning a new routine to "Drip-Drop." KG students continued practising "A Million Dreams," blending contemporary and ballet movements. Grades 1 and 2 wrapped up their hip-hop routine to "Believer," while Grades 3 to 5 focused on rehearsals for the Annual Day performances.

PE

Students practised sitting yoga asanas to improve flexibility, strengthen muscles, enhance posture, and boost energy. They also participated in an obstacle course with tunnels, cones, hurdles, and hula hoops, which helped develop their jumping, crawling, and hopping skills.

Third Language



German:

In Grade 5, students explored key grammar concepts, including singular and plural forms, gender of nouns, and the verb gehen (to go), and practised using the present tense in engaging ways.

Meanwhile, Grade 4 students reinforced their vocabulary and grammar knowledge through a fun and interactive German version of Snakes and Ladders, making revision both meaningful and enjoyable.

In July, students participated in a hands-on activity in German class. They were given blue and orange strips containing simple German dialogue sentences. After writing the dialogue, students arranged and pasted the strips in the correct order in their notebooks.

This activity helped students to:

- Practice basic introductions in German
- Understand sentence structure
- Improve reading and speaking skills
- Learn through an engaging, tactile approach

The colourful strips made the activity more enjoyable and enhanced their understanding of German greetings and personal information.


