





A standout moment was the 'Thrive in Action' segment — an interactive experience where participants explored the true meaning of THRIVE through visual storytelling and thoughtful reflections.



They began with storytelling and family portraits, reflecting on the people who shape their world. Through activities like brainstorming, creating relationship trees, and sorting connections, they identified relationships at home, school, and in the community.

As the unit progressed, they learned how to build positive relationships through empathy, active listening, and kindness. Their communication and social skills flourished through collaborative tasks. Throughout the inquiry, students embodied the IB Learner Profile by being caring, principled and open-minded for diverse perspectives—realizing how relationships shape who we are.

Students kickstarted their learning journey with a fun Mystery Bag activity, sparking curiosity around the theme of Food. A vibrant classroom setup with food cutouts and wrappers created an exciting environment for exploration. Under the concept of Function, children discovered the role of different foods in our lives through storybooks, comprehension activities, and vocabulary building. A hands-on sorting task helped them classify foods into groups like Carbohydrates, Proteins, Fats, Vitamins, and Minerals, deepening their understanding of healthy eating through active engagement.



A Quick Peek into Learning

Learners launched into their first Unit of Inquiry, "Sharing the Planet," with an engaging audio-visual on waste that sparked lively discussions and a collaborative concept map. They unpacked the central idea by exploring types of waste—biodegradable, non-biodegradable, wet, and dry—and the importance of using different colored bins. For a hands-on experience, students participated in a compost-making activity by bringing dry and wet waste from home, reinforcing the sustainable practices of the Four R's: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Respect. Under the conceptual lens of Change, they independently researched the impact of waste on the environment.

A Ouick Peek into Learning

Learners embarked on an exciting journey into the world of food processing, analyzing the differences between processed and unprocessed foods. Through research, discussions, and interactive activities, they explored highly, moderately, and minimally processed foods.

Hands-on experiments, e-learning modules, books, and videos helped students examine the concept of Causation—why food is processed and its impact. They also investigated various processing methods, leading to thoughtful conversations about the importance of food processing in our daily lives.

GRADE 5

TD Theme: Where we are in place and time **Central Idea:** Awareness of continuous change in the nature of the Earth helps human survival.

A Ouick Peek into Learning

Students were introduced to the central idea and collaboratively developed lines of inquiry, thoughtfully connecting them to key PYP concepts. The unit began with an exciting provocation, where students imagined viewing Earth from space and expressed their ideas through creative comic strips.

As their research journey unfolded, they explored the layers of the Earth, presenting their findings confidently to peers. Multimedia resources, note-taking activities, and comprehension exercises deepened their understanding. Moving into the first line of inquiry, students investigated Alfred Wegener's theory of continental drift, gaining fascinating insights into Pangaea and the formation of our continents.

HINDI

Grade - 1 (Akshar, Shabd & Greetings!)

Students reviewed Hindi Akshar, two-letter words, and simple sentences through activities like matching pictures and writing names/first letters. They also learned Hindi greetings (Suprabhat, Sumadhyan, Subh Ratri) and how to introduce themselves.

Grade 2

Grade 2 learners engaged in reading, writing, and recognizing Swar and Vyanjan. They revisited vowels (आ, इ, ई, उ, ऊ, ए) through words, sentences, and a passage. They also read a story and watched a video on healthy food habits.

Grade 3

Students revised sound-symbol relationships through Barahkhadi and learned number names in words and numerals (math integration). They read stories like कचरे का बादल and तीन R का जादू, followed by discussions and creating cover pages.

Grade 4

Students demonstrated their understanding of sound-symbol relationships through Shabd-seedhi and sentence framing. They read stories from Akbar and Birbal, Panchtantra, and Eeshap ki Kahaniyan, followed by discussion and story mapping.

Grade 5

Grade 5 students watched the animated story Follow Your Dreams, set personal goals, and discussed Earth's structure and landforms (unit integration). They also practiced reading comprehension, framed questions, and identified types of nouns in texts.









ART

Foundation 1 & Foundation 2

Young learners explored free expression and basic mark-making through joyful scribbling activities, focusing on motor skills, hand-eye coordination, color recognition, and confidence building.

Foundation 3

Learners expressed creativity through color choices in a coloring activity, developing fine motor control and hand-eye coordination by coloring within the lines.

Grade 1

Students experimented with various types of lines, creating artwork using diverse line styles.

Grade 2

A discussion on the role of experimentation and creativity in art led students to explore how different lines and patterns enhance visual appeal in artwork.

Grade 3

Learners explored overlapping shapes and patterns, experimenting with techniques to create complex visual compositions.

Grade 4

Students experimented with basic painting techniques like color mixing, blending, and brushwork, using gradient techniques for backgrounds and exploring unconventional methods.

Grade 5

Learners explored One-Point Perspective through a fish aquarium project, understanding concepts like horizon lines, vanishing points, and converging lines, while drawing inspiration from various fish species and coral reefs.









SEL

The first month of the new session focussed on goal-setting and self-awareness sessions, where children explored their emotions, strengths, and challenges in a supportive environment. With a variety of fun, reflective activities, they developed essential life skills such as emotional intelligence, confidence, resilience, and smart decision-making. This hands-on approach has allowed them to step into a journey of personal growth and self-discovery, preparing them for future challenges and successes!









DANCE

Foundation 1 & Foundation 2

Our little Goenkans are starting their learning journey with joy and enthusiasm! They engaged in the fun activity "Dance and Freeze," which helped develop their listening skills. This was followed by the energetic action song "Put Your Hands in the Air," adding even more excitement to their day.

Foundation 3

Students engaged in dynamic stretching exercises and lively jumping jacks to energizing dance routines. They are learning basic dance steps in freestyle.

Grades 1, 2 & 3

Students of Grades 1–3 are joyfully exploring self-expression through the energetic world of Hip-Hop and freestyle dance. With fun beats and creative movements, they're learning to groove and perform a dance routine to the song "Believer." Each session begins with a warm-up to boost flexibility and get their bodies ready to move.

Grade 4 & 5

Students have begun a graceful journey into the world of Kathak dance, starting with its foundational element—Tatkar, focusing on intricate footwork patterns. They are practicing Tatkar at different speeds, paired with elegant hand movements to enhance balance. Additionally, they've started working on circular movements to develop focus, rhythm, and body control.









Instrumental Music

GRADE 1:

Students have begun their musical journey by exploring what is music. They explored how they can express their feelings in music i.e., (sad, angry and happy) using the instrument Djembe.

GRADE 2:

Students were introduced to various sounds in our daily lives. They tried creating simple beats using the sounds while drinking or eating. They used syllables to create beats and learned about tempo on the djembe, an instrument that helps develop focus and concentration in students.

GRADE 3:

Students explored the importance of rhythm in music and learned about how to make a shaker with a waste bottle.

GRADES 4 and 5:

Students of Grade 4 made connections of different types of sounds on different instruments.





Vocal Music

Students across Grades 2–5 began their Western vocal music journey by exploring what music is, understanding body posture, and practicing vocal warm-ups and breathing exercises.

Grade 1 learned to sing the cheerful "Friend Song."

Grade 2 enjoyed singing "Here Comes the Sun", while Grade 3 engaged with "Recycle Rap."

Grade 4 explored pitch and breath control with "Food Glorious Food," and Grade 5 advanced their learning through "The Climb" and "Landform."



DRAMA

Nursery:

Children joyfully explored body parts through the lively poem enactment of Jiggle Wiggle, enhancing movement and recognition.

KG:

Through the poem My Family Tree, students are learning to express emotions and relationships on stage.

Grade 1:

Students engaged in a poem enactment of "Friends and Treasures" to deepen their understanding of friendship, nurturing empathy and effective communication skills.

Grade 2:

With The Food Parade, students enacted the journey of nutritious foods, blending learning and fun through role play.

Grade 3:

Students creatively brought waste management to life with "The Talking Trash", promoting awareness through drama.









PE

Students of Grades Foundation 3-5 enthusiastically practiced various locomotor movements like jumping, hopping, and crawling to enhance their coordination, balance, and strength with increased difficulty levels.

Additionally, Grade 4 students attended an insightful lecture by a school faculty on diet, vitamins, and nutrients, enriching their understanding through an engaging PE integration session.

Foundation 1 and Foundation 2 explored diverse fitness zones including the gym, billiards table, CrossFit area, squash courts, and swimming pool.









FOREIGN LANGUAGES

FRENCH

Grade 4 – Bonjour la France!

Grade 4 French learners began the term with great enthusiasm, exploring fun facts about France, its culture, and landmarks like the Eiffel Tower. They learned the French alphabet and numbers through songs, games, and interactive activities, building confidence in learning the language.

Grade 4




