TOK Workshop

TOK workshop on the 'unpacking TOK essay titles' was conducted by Dr. Usha Kamal, TOK Coordinator and Ms. Madhu Bhargava, TOK facilitator for grade 12 students of the diploma program. As part of the curriculum DP students have to write a 1600 words essay, an internal assessment component which carries sixty seven percent weightage towards their final TOK grade. The aim was to prepare the students, with skills to write an analytical and coherent essay. The workshop was very interactive, students used the forum to openly discuss the problems they faced with developing a knowledge question, linking and connecting them to their real life situations. Most of their doubts were cleared, and queries were resolved satisfactorily. They were given preparatory notes on all the six essay titles, on which they have to write 1000 word essays on any three of the essay titles during the summer holidays. They were advised to maintain academic honesty. The workshop was well received by both students and teachers.


Spanish Poster Making

Since last July, I've been teaching at Nai Kiran Universal School, a school for underprivileged children run by Guru Nanak Seva Sanstha in Ardee City, Gurgaon. Located on the roadside, with nothing but canvas sheets above their heads, the school has children from grades 1 to 10. Last July, I began to teach English and History to the students of Grade 7. I've learnt that when it comes to teaching, it's important to understand the student's perception of the subject rather than blazing ahead with their syllabus.

Teaching at the school wasn't easy, at least at first. It took me a week to understand what their syllabus and what their understanding of the subject was like. Once I had a good grasp of that, I tried to come up with easier ways to explain a concept to them, rather than simply reading it aloud from a book. Within a few weeks, they began to understand simple grammatical concepts better and work towards writing detailed passages.

Last year, Kalpana got admission into Rotary Public School and has been studying there ever since. Juel and Vinod duly followed suit and began their first semester at Rotary Public School this April. In fact, Vinod and Kalpana got 99+ percentile in their IQ test held by Mensa International at the school in December 2016.

Even though they no longer study at Nai Kiran, they still drop by every Saturday and I help them with their current school syllabus. Kalpana took up French in her new school, and every Saturday I help her with verb conjugations and grammatical concepts she perhaps wouldn't have been able to learn at Nai Kiran.

It has been an amazing experience teaching here and I look forward to seeing more of my students going ahead to mainstream schools in the next academic year.
