
THE WORLD SCHOLAR'S CUP: AN OVERVIEW







OUR MASCOT



HISTORY History of Diplomacy



Keynote Speaker

AARON M. ELLISON

aron M. Ellison is an ecologist, writer, and photographer whose work linking science and the creative arts is aimed at communicating scientific concepts to broad audiences and encouraging empathy in them for all creatures large and small.

A Pennsylvania native who has made New England his home for more than 40 years, Ellison has been the Senior Research Fellow in Ecology at Harvard University and a Senior Ecologist at the Harvard Forest since 2002. He studies the disintegration and reassembly of ecosystems following natural and anthropogenic disturbances; thinks about the relationship between the Dao and the Intermediate Disturbance Hypothesis, reflects on the critical and reactionary stance of Ecology relative to Modernism, blogs as The Unbalanced Ecologist, and tweets as @AMaxEll17.

Ellison was in the first class (1992) of Presidential Faculty Fellows recognized by the US National Science Foundation for "demonstrated excellence and continued promise both in scientific and engineering research and in teaching future generations of students to extend and apply human knowledge" and was elected a Fellow of the Ecological Society of America in 2012.

Most recently, Ellison has collaborated with the Cambridge, Massachusetts-based artist and designer David Buckley Borden to create at Harvard Forest the immersive installation Hemlock Hospice, part of this year's Art and Music selections. Hemlock Hospice blends science, art, and design in respecting the eastern hemlock tree and its ecological role as a foundation forest species; promoting an understanding of the adelgid; and encouraging empathetic conversations among all the sustainers of and caregivers for our forests—ecologists and artists, foresters and journalists, naturalists and citizens—while fostering social cohesion around ecological issues.

Yale University Speakers



Pilar Velasco is a Spanish journalist currently working at Cadena SER (Prisa Group), the radio network leader in Spain. Specializing in investigative and data journalism, she has exposed political and economic malpractices in Spain and uncovered high profile international corruption cases. Her reports have focused on revealing unlawful and unethical activities of the powerful against the public interest. Pilar is the author of two books, one about social change in Spain; and another one about the rise of indignados (Occupy) movement, both of which have been translated into several languages. She is a member of the Strategy Group 'A Soul of Europe', a European Union initiative to strengthen and connect communities through different frames of discussion. Pilar teaches investigative journalism in Madrid and presents at conferences across Europe and Latin America. She is also the Founder and a Board Member of the Spanish Association of Investigative Journalists with the aim of promoting cross-border investigative journalism and reinforcing freedom of expression.



MERCEDES CARRERAS
SENIOR DIVISION

Professor Mercedes Carreras is a senior lector at Yale University in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese, as well as a lecturer in the Ethics, Politics and Economics Program and Engineering and Applied Sciences. She graduated from the University of Valencia with a PhD in Law summa cum laude and received a Fulbright Grant to study at the Yale Law School as a visiting scholar. Mercedes has written two books in Spanish, Vilfredo Pareto: A Theory of Economic Freedom and Political Elitism and An Approach to Feminist Jurisprudence, which won the María Isidra de Guzmán award for her research. Additionally, she has published and translated numerous papers on ethics, law, moral philosophy, medicine and literature, including most recently "The Colloquium of Dogs and the Human Condition" (El Coloquio de los Perros y la Condición Humana). Mercedes is in the board of referees for The Journal of Medical Education (UK, Wiley) and The Medical Teacher (UK, Wiley) and is passionate about teaching, mentoring and advising students at Yale. In her free time, she likes to play tennis, and listen to classical music and opera.
