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BRIDGE COURSE FOR GRADE XI

A SMOOTH TRANSITION TO IB

The first day of the Bridge Course began with a brief introduction given by the Diploma Program Coordinator, Dr. Manisha Mehta. The Director-Principal, Dr. Neeta Bali, addressed the students on the relevance and significance of the course and motivated them to make the most of it.

The first session was conducted by the Head of the Humanities Department, Ms. Sudha Bhatia and her team. The students did an activity called "Unraveling the Group 3 Disciplines", where they researched the key terms specific to the subject of their choice. The activity was based on the IB Learner Profile, "inquirer". The students were also introduced to the research skills necessary for the IB Curriculum through a brief presentation.

The second session was conducted by the CAS Coordinator, Mr. Jinas Panicker, the Vice CAS secretary, Anisha Sethi and Vice cultural head, Ananya Singh. It was an interactive session as senior students introduced the core component of the IB Diploma Program and explained the importance of CAS. The three strands of CAS were explained in detail: Creativity, Activity and Service. The students were also given an overview of the kind of portfolio they need to maintain which includes all proposal and reflection forms. One CAS project is an essential part that should include two or more core strands of CAS. Towards the end of the session, students were given an opportunity to ask questions and clear their doubts.

The third session of the day was conducted by the Head of the Foreign Languages Department, Ms. Sujata Pant and her team. An activity was done to develop interactive skills for the Individual oral assessment which is based on the course themes: identities, experiences, human ingenuity, social organization and sharing the planet. The students were given a sample image and they worked in pairs to express themselves in their chosen foreign language as per the guidance and rules reiterated to them. It was a new experience for them as IOP is a unique component of IB.

The fourth session was conducted by the Head of the Science Department, Ms. Sonia Kochhar and team on Research Skills and References. The fifth session was conducted by the Head of the Visual Arts Department, Mr. Amitabh Ranjan and two senior students. A presentation was shown to students.

The first day of the Bridge Course ended with a session by the Head of the English Department, Ms. Anupama Chopra and her team. The students were given an activity to identify global issues from a stimulus. The activity started by showing a video and children were told the difference between answer types and the various requirements of IBDP. The students enjoyed the activity thouroughly.





On behalf of the Germany Embassy, Max Mueller Bhavan invited our German Language learners to a Music Concert at Modern School, Vasant Vihar which was held on 24th April by the German music Band group "Lebensmusiker" which is German for "life musicians". CLS, IG, and IBDP German students attended the concert, accompanied by the German teacher, Ms. Mahak.

The five "life musicians" between 22 and 60, played songs from a variety of musical backgrounds and played handmade, lifeaffirming pop with German lyrics which kept the audience engaged. It was a really good learning experience for all German students and they explored this opportunity in a creative way.



IB Learner Profile Assembly

The session concluded with an interaction where the students from the audience spoke about which IB Learner Profiles are depicted by the Director Principal, the Deputy Head Mistress and the Diploma Program Coordinator.
