During the CAS month, the students of grade 11 and 12 collaborated to initiate various engaging CAS projects. The projects are as follows:

E-library

"A library is many things, it's a place to go, to get in and out of the rain, it's a place to go if you want to sit and think. But particularly, it's a place where books live, and it's where the soul of a school lives. We may have to leave the school building for now, but we'll never give up its soul." For this CAS project, the students have created an online library. During this lockdown many people are unable to access their physical resources or are finding it difficult to collect resources online. So, in order to provide these resources to the students, parents and even teachers, the core team: (Parisha, Naman, Rakshita, Elena, Praman, Harsh and Shreya) along with six 11th graders, prepared a drive where they have collected and stored e-books, e-notes, past papers, links to several websites, crash courses for all grades, everything from as big as a required IB textbook to as small as that one equation you just can't understand. It is the one-stop for all information you may reasonably require for learning, but be deceived not, this is not a service bounded only to few students - this is something for the Goenkan fraternity, by the Goenkan fraternity. The students not only have focused on academic resources, but also included apps and websites where people can acquire a new skill or a hobby from the safety of their homes.





Since this is a CAS project, the students ensured that they completed all the CAS stages in order to achieve the aim of devising new planning strategies and tried to create a wholesome yet helpful working environment for everyone. As they also collaborated with grade 11 students, ways were devised to overcome common challenges such as cooperation and coordination while working for this project and it was the most crucial part while working online. This project helped the students to become better thinkers and communicators, and they also developed skills for inquiry and research.

The Earth Saviours foundation is home to more than 500 underprivileged and mentally challenged people. During this crucial time of COVID19 they were lacking essential needs like food, clothes and medical aids. Therefore to help them the students of GD Goenka world school initiated a CAS project "3N Daan".

अN Daan is a food donation drive where essential food items were collected and donated.

The donor was requested to make a bag that consisted of 5 items:

- 5 Kg Wheat
- 1 kg Sugar
- 1 kg Pulses
- 1 L oil
- glucose biscuits





The donator kept this bag at their main gate and it was collected by the staff of The Earth Saviours Foundation. The core team played a huge role in promoting the campaign of $\Im N$ Daan through various posters and videos. They also polished most of their IB learner profiles like knowledgeable, thinkers, caring, communicators, balanced, principled and reflective.

Their aim was to collect 40 bags but they actually collected more than 120 bags! Which is more than 600 kilograms of wheat, 120 litres of oil, 240 packets of glucose biscuits, 120 kilograms of sugar.

Opportunity in Crisis Webinar

Due to the covid-19 pandemic, many countries have temporarily closed down schools, colleges and universities, bringing about a sudden change in the education system. The lockdown has greatly impacted the social life and learning of children all over the world. Furthermore, online teaching is hard to adapt to for both students as well as teachers. These interruptions may not only have a shortterm consequence, instead it can have long term consequences which we must try to reduce. Faced with uncertainty and a lack of the conventional resources, we have to be able to seize the opportunities presented to us.



Hence, the students of Grade 12 initiated a CAS project to conduct a series of webinars to inform students about the opportunity in the crisis. The first webinar was conducted for the students of IBDP, wherein we were joined by Mr. Deepak Sharma, seasoned learning and development professional with more than 14 years of experience, having conducted training programs for various reputed organizations like HDFC Sales, India bulls Housing Finance, Piramal Capital, Future Group, Avighna and various Colleges and Schools. Mr. Deepak Sharma held an interactive session in which he spoke about the various ways we can uplift ourselves and pursue our goals, all the while maintaining a productive routine, so as to maintain our mental health. This was followed by a question-answer round, in which multiple students raised their doubts, and were enthusiastically responded by Mr. Deepak Sharma. The second session was conducted for the students of MYP, wherein he spoke about the efficient use of the internet during the lockdown and the impact of Covid-19 on education. The interactive session enabled students of Grade 6th-8th to participate in discussions concerning the pandemic, all the while reflecting on their own personal experiences.

This ongoing project encouraged us to research and spread awareness on topics that are of utmost prevalence during this lockdown. Being able to gain expert insight as well as the opportunity to share our own knowledge with students of various ages helped us develop as IB learners, for we learnt the importance of time management and seizing the various opportunities we are presented with.

Two agendas were set for the General Assembly - The Right to Self Determination with Special Emphasis in Crimea and The Kashmir Conflict. The International Press Corps was responsible for the documentation of the committee and presentation of the conference newsletters. The General Assembly was chaired by Mikul Manocha and guest chair Arya Agrawal. The committee encouraged many healthy and fruitful discussions, with introduction of 7 crisis updates, which the committee handled well. Vikram Anand Thakur grabbed the best delegate award, followed by Yash Kumar with the High Commendation.

International Interact Webinar

An international Interact webinar was held on 21st June 2020. The Interact core team members from GDGWS joined Director- Principal, Dr Neeta Bali; DHM, Ms Shanaz Banno Butt and Rotarian Dr Nischal Pnadey to discuss how Interact clubs selflessly serve people.
