
INVESTITURE CEREMONY

Reading for the mind







ASSEMBLIES TEACHINGS OF NELSON MANDELA

HIROSHI<mark>MA DAY</mark>





AQUAWASH


IBDP year 2 students, Sumer Kaistha and Harsh Gupta developed a useful app 'AquaWash'.

It is more necessary than ever to wash our hands regularly and at the correct times to promote cleanliness and hygiene. They have developed an app called AquaWash which was created with the intention to aid our community and help promote hygiene and safety in the society. It is programmed to use advanced



algorithms to send you notifications based upon your location and the time of the day. This app makes use of location services and sends you notifications to remind you to wash your hands when you enter a set location, such as your home or workplace. Furthermore, it allows the user to schedule the frequency and time of notification. The user is also able to decide whether they want notifications when they are within a certain locality or not through the use of a simple switch. These features allow the users to decide and set flexible timings for the notifications retrieved according to their daily schedule. It is an important, user-friendly application which allows you to quickly set crucial reminders for washing your hands based upon your schedule.

"We hope to assist everyone to stay healthy and safe during these harsh times and this app is a simple and efficient method to promote public health" opined our innovative students.




ASPIRING AUTHOR

Extremely well presented by all students and staff, the programme was a grand success.






CAS IN THE IB

MASK DONATION DRIVE




INTER-HOUSE DEBATE

Event 1: Model Making: Grades 6 to 8 -Topic - Young innovator's race to save the world (Making energy related models with minimum carbon footprint)


Event 2: Online Quiz: Grades 9 &10

The inaugural address to august gathering was given by our revered Director Principal, Dr Neeta Bali who welcomed the teams and mentioned that we have revived this event this year.

Highlighting the overwhelming response received for this event, she added that twenty seven schools comprising of 400 participants from across, participated in the event.

The idea for such events was to create an online community for students to create camaraderie by coming together and sharing knowledge & experiences. To grace the occasion and honour us with their esteemed presence, were the judges for various events who were eminent personalities from the Scientific Community. The jury for the competition comprised of Dr. Dipankar Saha, Dr Vallika Reddy, Dr Neena Jain, Dr Divya Jain, Dr Minakshi Chauhan, Mr Pivush Goval and Mr Ravi Kochhar.



The Contemporary classical dance performance by Ms Rajsi Sharma, a student of IBDP who enthralled one instrumental and all. The performance by Ms Ahra Jo, a student of grade 9, who played the school song on a piano, eased the anxiety of the participants before the event. The participants were segregated into different breakout rooms. Participants in each group demonstrated immense zeal and were bubbling with energy & joy.

For Quiz, there were 27 teams. The elimination round was used to shortlist 6 teams for the final round.

Similarly, Model making had a total of 34 teams contesting and for Poster presentation, the number of entries was 17. The judges appreciated the innovation, articulation and the critical thinking skills, exhibited by the participants.

Before the closing ceremony, the head of IB Diploma Program, Dr Manisha Mehta interacted with the judges and the students to bring them on a common platform. The judges applauded the efforts of the teachers and the students. Mr Piyush Goyal, one our judges quoted that he had attended so many virtual meetings globally but this event was so well managed both in terms of technology and team-work from GDGWS that it could be benchmarked with any other world class virtual-meet. Dr Dipankar Saha, while stating that our future is in the right hands since students are really conscious about the concept of sustainability, highlighted that cultural & environmental awareness begins from the family & is engraved in its roots and which is where the solutions emerge from.




website provides the most popular books written by authors, with features such as night read, zoom in & out, bookmarking etc.

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION


