


Finger on the Pulse!

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

Our team from the international DP CAS Student Summit 2021 was chosen among the top 3 teams to present our project at the international LCASP Exhibit on the 4th of February 2021, out of more than 25 teams, with each team consisting of at least 8 students.

In August 2021 we started with 2 groups. I was chosen as the leader for one of the groups. Later on, the groups merged, hence forming Demolishment of Poverty Youth Organization – or DOP Youth; an organization aimed to assist and demolish poverty, striving to help those in need and self-sustain through commitment, creativity, and youth.
