## **Exploring Possibilities- Wonders of Mathematics**



I am still a fighter, still a warrior,


wounded and gazed,


















#### SHORT STORY BY MANIL MIDDHA (GRADE 9 IGCSE)

'You betrayed me?' whispered Jason.


'You fool...I did not betray you...I betrayed the kingdom'. Lia said sadistically.
