A quick peek into learning-

Under the third line of inquiry, "How seasons affect our lifestyle," students actively engaged in exploring seasonal changes and their impact. They created a weather chart, representing sunny days with a sun, cloudy days with a cloud, and rainy days with a cloud and raindrops. Through this activity, they identified clothing suitable for different seasons-woollen caps, mufflers, gloves, and jackets for winter; skirts, t-shirts, shorts, goggles, and caps for summer. They also crafted a collage of seasonal clothing and designed a tree adorned with flowers to represent spring.

A quick peek into learning-

In our recent story exploration, kindergarten students discovered key story elements through "Kiki the Kangaroo," learning about characters, story structure—beginnings, middles, and ends and the morals within each tale.

A vibrant Story Walk turned an open field into an interactive storytelling space, where students shared observations and illustrated their favorite scenes. Adding a special touch, Sovit's mother from Nursery captivated the children with "The Ant and the Leaf," fostering joy and curiosity in our school community.

A Quick Peek into learning-

Children learned about the life cycles of various living things, including butterflies, plants, and humans. They explored how grow, change, living organisms and reproduce, which sparks curiosity and wonder about the natural world. Students enjoyed studying stages like the plant cycle from seed to sprout to flower and fruit, and the butterfly's transition from egg to larva to pupa to adult. They enhanced their communication skills through discussions on the needs of a plant and the parts of the plant.

A Quick Peek into learning-

Students deepened their understanding of the unit by exploring shadows at different times of the day—morning, noon, and afternoon—observing how their size and shape changed. They reflected on their observations using various Visible Thinking Routines and connected their learning about time with Math concepts.

Exploring the importance and uses of light proved to be an enriching experience. The unit concluded with a summative task where students collaborated in groups to demonstrate light experiments. They also crafted and presented an engaging story using shadow puppets. The unit fostered curiosity, built knowledge, and embodied key PYP attributes.

Peek into Ouick learning: A Learners enhanced their understanding of physical and chemical changes in matter hands-on experiments. through Thev observed the differences between these changes and created a T-Chart to organize and reflect on their findings. Additionally, they watched several experiments to understand the relationship between these changes. To culminate this unit of inquiry with a summative task, the learners chose an object of their choice stated its properties, and the effects of temperature on that specific matter, and explained the physical and chemical changes to occur in that object. This fostered their curiosity and developed the learner's attributes.

A Quick Peek into learning-

The unit began with a pre-assessment and provocation, where students observed machines. identified key parts, and discussed "A Day Without Machines." They explored the six types of simple machines through interactive activities, e-learning resources, and guizzes on guizizz.com. Students conducted research, read e-books, and examined simple machines in their daily lives. They created models using materials, various developing selfmanagement skills, and presented them to peers, explaining their form and function. Reflections were organized using graphic language organizers, and integration included creative poems about simple machines, showcasing their understanding in an engaging way.

Central Idea: Being responsible for a balanced intake of nutrients may lead to well-being. Lines of Inquiry: LOI 1- Diseases caused due to imbalance intake of nutrients. Peek Ouick into A learning-This month, students explored steps to prevent nutritional diseases and presented their findings confidently. They worked in groups, using the 5 Whys technique to identify the root causes nutrition-related of issues. demonstrating strong self-management and social skills. Students critically analyzed a text malnutrition and, as action an on step, designed board and card games to raise about preventing awareness nutritional diseases. They also listed local and global organizations addressing these issues and discussed a WHO report on malnutrition. Through this unit, students gained valuable insights into the importance of macro and micronutrients in maintaining a balanced diet.



Grade 1: Students practiced reading and writing words and sentences with 'ਤੇ' and answered comprehension maatra questions. They were introduced to $'\overline{3}'$ maatra through a YouTube story, participated in reading and writing activities, and took part in a "Show and Tell" on 'Living and Non-Living Things' to observation, develop speaking, and communication skills.

Grade 2: Students learned the names of animals and birds, practiced sentence reading and writing, and participated in comprehension activities. They engaged in the 'Suno Aur Likho' activity and explored picture writing through fill-in-the-blank exercises.

Grade 3: Students read stories, practiced picture writing, and worked on comprehension exercises. They explored Adjectives through interactive activities and enhanced vocabulary by reading the unit-based story 'रसोई घर में भांप.'

Grade 4: Students improved reading skills through story sessions, followed by picture writing and comprehension exercises. They deepened their understanding of Verbs after a prior knowledge assessment and various engaging tasks.

Grade 5: Students practiced reading comprehension and story writing, refining their thinking and writing abilities.









Grades Nursery-K.G:- Students were encouraged to visualize and draw from their imagination. Simple prompts were given and then they freely drew their unique ideas through drawing.

Grade 1- Learners explored the concept of texture in art by experimenting with material rubbings, creating impressions of different surfaces using various materials.

Grade 2- To explore the concept of landscapes and its elements—foreground, middleground, and background—learners arranged these components in their artwork to create depth, enhancing their artistic skills, spatial awareness, and creative thinking.

Grade 3- Learners enhanced their creativity through Micrography Art, blending text and design by repeatedly writing words to fill outlines. They experimented with size, direction, and spacing to add texture and depth to their artwork.

Grade 4- Learners used lines and repeated shapes to create a simple optical illusion, exploring how patterns and alternating designs can produce visual effects of movement and depth.

Grade 5- To explore how artists use line, pattern, and texture to convey ideas and emotions, learners experimented with these elements to create a Zentangle Collage. They discovered the versatility of line in art, using patterns and colors to enhance visual interest and developing their creativity through mixed-media techniques in their chosen subject.







Drama

Grades Nursery to 2

In the recent drama classes for nursery to grade 2, the focus was on enhancing creative expression and physical coordination. Nursery students brought popular rhymes to life through engaging enactments, fostering confidence and imagination. For KG to grade 2, the sessions revolved around poem enactments, encouraging voice modulation, expressions, and storytelling. Additionally, activities targeting body balance were incorporated, helping students improve their physical awareness and motor skills while having fun. These sessions aimed to develop foundational drama skills in a joyful and interactive manner.

Grades 3 - 5

Students of grades 3 to 5 showcased their talent and teamwork through the rehearsal and performance of a heartwarming Christmas play centered on the birth of Jesus. The play highlighted the significance of the Nativity story, with students portraying characters like Mary, Joseph, the angels, and the shepherds with enthusiasm and grace. Through dedicated practice, they honed their acting skills, voice modulation, and expressions while embracing the spirit of Christmas.




The celebration concluded with the resounding school motto, Higher, Stronger, Brighter!, symbolizing unity and excellence.
