




Message from the PYP Coordinator, Ms. Poonam Singh

A Quick Peek into learning

Throughout the unit under the TD Theme 'Sharing the Planet,' children explored resource conservation by understanding the two main types: renewable and non-renewable resources. They created a Problem-Solution Chart, identifying issues such as fossil fuel overuse, water wastage, and deforestation, while proposing solutions like using bicycles, harvesting rainwater, and planting trees.

To take action, children made pledges and set personal goals, such as taking shorter showers and not wasting paper. Through these activities, they developed ATL skills and embodied the IB Learner Profile, becoming more responsible and reflective global citizens.

They brought artefacts from home and shared their significance with their peers. As part of the second line of inquiry, guest speakers were invited, allowing students to gain insights and develop the PYP attributes of respect and tolerance. To deepen their understanding, they interviewed their grandparents and parents, reflecting on how traditions have evolved

A Quick Peek into learning

The students were inspired by a classroom setup featuring images of renowned leaders from around the world. They observed and discussed the qualities of these leaders, reflecting on leadership attributes creating a mind map. With curiosity, they spun the wheel to explore their roles as leaders and how to handle different fostering essential situations, learning attributes. As part of language integration, they read comprehension passages to understand the characteristics of a leader. Additionally, they mapped famous leaders to their respective countries on a world map. To consolidate their learning, they engaged in various games, leading their groups and demonstrating their leadership skills.

A Quick Peek into learning

Under the TD Theme "How We Express Ourselves", students were tuned in through a KWL chart to reflect on what they already knew, what they wanted to learn, and what they discovered about performing arts. explored various art forms, including drama, dance, and music, as ways to communicate ideas (Function). Through discussions with subject experts, they gained insight into how artists use their work to express their unique perspectives and emotions (Perspective). They also explored the significance of teamwork in bringing ideas to collaboratively For the summative (Responsibility). assessment, students explored themes such as Christmas celebrations and the triumph of Good over Evil, using their creativity to portray these This through performances. encouraged students to express themselves with confidence, appreciate diverse art forms, and recognize the importance of collaboration in creating meaningful performances.

A Quick Peek into learning

Students curated their poems into a poetry booklet, exploring poetic devices and integrating them into their writing to enhance their creativity. Through reading, analyzing, and interpreting poetry, they shared their unique perspectives. They also exchanged their poems with peers, fostering mutual appreciation. Throughout the unit, they learned to express emotions, feelings, and experiences through poetry. Additionally, they composed poems for their exhibition groups.



ART Specialist Subjects



Grades Nursery and KG - Learners enthusiastically participated in a colouring activity. They were given blank sheets and a variety of colours to express their creativity freely. This activity allowed them to explore different colour combinations, develop fine motor skills, and enjoy the process of creating art without any restrictions.

Grades 1 and 2 - To encourage selfexpression, develop creativity, and express ideas visually learners used their imagination to create an artwork. They illustrate their thoughts, dreams, and ideas through drawing. Experiment with different colors to express and develop artistic confidence while making their artwork.

Grade 3 - Learners participated in an imaginational drawing activity using prompts. They were given creative prompts which encouraged them to think outside the box, express their ideas visually, and use their creativity freely. They enjoyed using a mix of colours, shapes and patterns to tell their imaginative stories bringing their visions to life.

Grades 4 and 5 - To recognize that art can be created in many ways, and there is no right or wrong, learners experimented with different techniques used in abstract art. Identify how it differs from realistic art. Learners used shapes, colors, and lines to create their abstract artwork.









Foreign Languages

SPANISH

March was a dynamic month for Spanish learners in Grades 4 and 5. To prepare for the Term 2 assessments, students actively participated in a series of engaging revision sessions. These included flipped classroom activities, grammar-based quizzes, and vocabulary drills, which helped reinforce key language skills in an interactive and fun way.

GERMAN

This term, Grade 4 students revisited subject pronouns and key verbs sein and haben, building confidence in forming simple sentences. They expanded their vocabulary with classroom-related words and creatively used the verb heißen to introduce family members. An interactive poem activity with music and movement helped reinforce numbers and body parts vocabulary. The term ended with a thorough review and a summative assessment celebrating their progress in German.

FRENCH

Grade 4 - Students revised subject pronouns and key verbs like être, avoir, and s'appeler, using them to describe themselves and their families. Vocabulary learning came alive through a non-fire cooking activity and interactive dance sessions that reinforced numbers and body parts. The year concluded with a review and final assessment.

Grade 5 – French Classroom Highlights This term focused on themes like clothing, home, animals, and transport, with students building vocabulary and refining grammar through fun activities. They practiced listening, reading, and speaking skills while also exploring irregular verbs and daily routines. The term wrapped up with a comprehensive review and final exam.
